

# IT'S SHOPPING TIME!

Explore Rome's best shopping destinations: a wide range of local crafts, vintage shops, luxury boutiques and Sunday markets! **Duration: 5 hours // Starting Point: Merulana Inn**

## 1 *Via del Corso // Piazza di Spagna*

### How to get there:

from Merulana Inn head to Termini station, take the tube and get off at Flaminio Station // Piazza del Popolo (Linea A).

Via del Corso is one of the most attractive shopping avenues in Rome. This road connects Piazza del Popolo to Piazza Venezia (1,5 km) and it is the link road to Piazza di Spagna and Fontana di Trevi.

The boulevard is very popular for the wide variety of shops available for all budgets. Once you get there do not miss:

- **La Rinascente // Via del Tritone** - a wonderful world made of women, men and kids' fashion, beauty, jewelry, home design pieces, and food courts.

In the Rinascente mall, you will be amazed by the variety of shopping opportunities and by its enchanting atmosphere.

- **Galleria Alberto Sordi** - the Galleria hosts fashion boutiques for women, men and kids in a very prestigious architectural designed building full of history.

- **Via del Tritone, Via Frattina, Via Borgognona, Via dei Condotti, Via del Babuino.**

Have you always been fashioned by Italian firms? These roads are the place to be!

Valentino, Gucci, Prada, Cavalli, Alviero Martini, Brunello Cucinelli together with luxury local shops and international firms like Chanel, Louis Vuitton, Tiffany, Burberry and many more: immerse yourself into fashion even if is just for a look at the beautiful shop windows, especially during Christmas time!

## 2 *Via dei Giubbonari // Campo de Fiori*

### How to get there:

Via del Corso heads to Piazza Venezia. From there, take rail bus n.8 and get off at Arenula/Cairolì. (5 mins)

- From Merulana Inn enjoy a walk to Piazza Venezia (15mins) and then take rail bus n. 8 to Arenula / Cairolì.

Via dei Giubbonari is the road just in front of the rail bus stop which will lead you to Campo de' Fiori, a window on the city as we love it, next door to Piazza Navona.

In this area, you will enjoy some very intriguing shops, as well as some craft boutiques and traditional artist ateliers. Be amazed by the roads around Piazza Navona - Via del Corallo, Via dei Leutari & Via del Governo Vecchio to see some unique pieces made in Rome.

### ! *Tips!*

Once you get there, we strongly suggest you a quick stop for some authentic local products at the Salumeria Roscioli. This shop is a traditional deli taverna where you can taste the best quality of cured meat, cheese, and other specialties, or sit down for a quick lunch with Pizza & Mortadella.

If you love markets, in the morning go and have a look to Piazza de' Fiori.

## 3 *Trastevere // Viale Marconi*

### How to get there:

From Arenula/Cairolì, get the rail bus n. 8 towards Casaletto and get off at Trastevere/Mastai (2 stops away) or walk until you cross the river Tiber (15 mins)

- From Merulana Inn, enjoy a walk to Piazza Venezia (15mins) and then take rail bus n. 8 to Trastevere/Mastai.

Welcome to a very stylish district where shopping can become a unique experience. Music shops, art galleries, craft, vintage and second-hand, leather and delicatessen boutiques: this district has a lot to offer.

Once you get off from the bus get in the district: Wherever you will go, in this area you will discover something unexpected!

If you prefer to go mainstream, get down to Viale Marconi (walk towards Trastevere station and cross the bridge) and enjoy the boulevard: the shops are open until 8 pm.

### ! *Tips!*

During Sunday mornings, Trastevere gets busy with the Porta Portese Market. Not to be missed if you love Sunday markets and finding good deals on antiques or fashion garments.
